

Changes in the laboratory's ownership, organization, location, infrastructure or approved methodology need to be communicated to and agreed by Mondelēz International Corporate Microbiology prior to implementation. Furthermore, any quality failure that may adversely affect the accuracy of results, must be reported immediately to Mondelēz International Corporate Microbiology, irrespective of whether the laboratory is currently testing for us or not. Please note that Mondelēz International reserves the right to immediately disapprove any laboratory under the following circumstances:

- 1) A major quality failure that has a critical and adverse impact upon the accuracy of results
- 2) A failure to communicate a significant organizational change which may adversely affect the quality of service or accuracy of results
- 3) Any breach of confidentiality agreement with your customers
- 4) Withdrawal of accreditation status on the method of concern based on a major quality failure or performance issues
